- 3. Agenda adopted without objection. Item 7 (Statutes working group update) of the agenda moved after item 4 on the request of Statutes Working Group Chair, Honorary President Margareta SÖRENSON.
- 4. Minutes for 12 March 2022 meeting of the Executive Committee adopted without objection. No matters arose from these minutes.
- 5. Discussion of Statutes Working Group:

Members of the Working Group present at the meeting included the Chair of the Working Group, Honorary President Margareta SÖRENSON, and member of the Executive Committee: Thailand (Pawit MAHARASINAND).

Margareta SÖRENSON spoke about contributions of a member of the Executive Committee, Manabu NODA (Japan), to the work on defining the distribution of power in the Statutes and asked him to participate in upcoming meetings of the working group.

There was a lengthy discussion of numerous issues around article 6 (former article 4) of the Statues, including clarification of certain issues from the March meeting. A wide range of ideas emerged related to the structure and distribution of power in management of AICT-IATC, as Margareta SÖRENSON proposed to take the Cabinet out of the Statutes. The discussion also involved a case for the need to empower the officers to accomplish various tasks.

The Chair of the Working Group thanked the members of the ExCom for their input.

The President thanked the Working Group and Manabu NODA for their input and suggested that the proposed revisions be ready for distribution by summer.

6. Cabinet Updates:

Michel VAÏS spoke about the importance of writing the history of AICT-IATC and proposed to remind Honorary President Margareta SÖRENSON to write on the years of her presidency to continue the history.

Michel VAÏS also noted that the General Secretary transition is going well.

The President mentioned that several Executive Committee members and honorary presidents of the AICT-IATC were invited to the Craiova International Shakespeare Festival. Michel VAÏS was also invited to hold a public discussion with Robert Lepage. The President also spoke about the proposal from the Festival that the leadership of AICT-IATC be invited to bestow an award upon Romanian cultural leader and actor, the late Ion Caramitru. A discussion followed about the possibilities of participation in this event.

Therefore, the Polish Section, who was unable to move the workshop to a later date, decided to organize the young critics' training independently. Jean-Pierre HAN also updated that there will be a young critics workshop in Brussels in September 2022 during a Women Festival and mentioned that he will be asking honorary president Margareta SÖRENSON to participate as a mentor.
